Dear Sir or Madam:

The Communications Act states, "Whoever utters any obscene, indecent, or profane language by means of radio communication shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than two years, or both."

On March 12, 2002, between 9:00 pm and 10:00 pm (CST), _____ (station call letters) broadcast "Philly." In the course of the program, Maguire, a defense attorney, in a heated argument with an assistant district attorney who yells at her, "There's no way I'm gonna stand up in open court with my dick in my hand while your [client] walks out the door!"

I believe that this language constitutes profane and indecent language in violation of the Communications Act. The Communications Act states, "Whoever utters any obscene, indecent, or profane language by means of radio communication shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than two years, or both."

In addition, the FCC has defined broadcast indecency as "language or material that, in context, depicts, describes, in terms patently offensive as measured by contemporary community broadcast standards for the broadcast medium, sexual or excretory organs or activities."

Please be assured this type of language violates our community broadcast standards, as it has never, to my knowledge, been presented in any other broadcast medium licensed by the FCC.

I hereby request the Federal Communications Commission conduct an official investigation of television station _____ (call letters), _____ (station address), _____ (city, state, zip) , for the broadcast of obscene and indecent language.

Please notify me of the action taken regarding this complaint.
